Jonah 4:1–11

But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. 2 And  
he prayed to the Lord and said, “O Lord, is not this what I said  
when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee  
to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful,  
slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting  
from disaster. 3 Therefore now, O Lord, please take my life from  
me, for it is better for me to die than to live.” 4 And the Lord said,  
“Do you do well to be angry?”

5 Jonah went out of the city and sat to the east of the city and  
made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, till  
he should see what would become of the city. 6 Now the Lord  
God appointed a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it  
might be a shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort.  
So Jonah was exceedingly glad because of the plant. 7 But when  
dawn came up the next day, God appointed a worm that  
attacked the plant, so that it withered.

Jonah 4:1–11 (cont’d)

8 When the sun rose, God appointed a scorching east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint. And he asked that he might die and said, “It is better for me to die than to live.” 9 But God said to Jonah, “Do you do well to be angry for the plant?” And he said, “Yes, I do well to be angry, angry enough to die.” 10 And the Lord said, “You pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and perished in a night. 11 And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?”

Colossians 3:5–18

Put to death therefore what is earthly in you:sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. 6 On account of these the wrath of God is coming. 7 In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. 8 But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. 9 Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices 10 and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. 11 Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

12 Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, 13 bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. 14 And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. 15 And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to

God. 17 And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Matthew 9:35–38

And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; 38 therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.”
